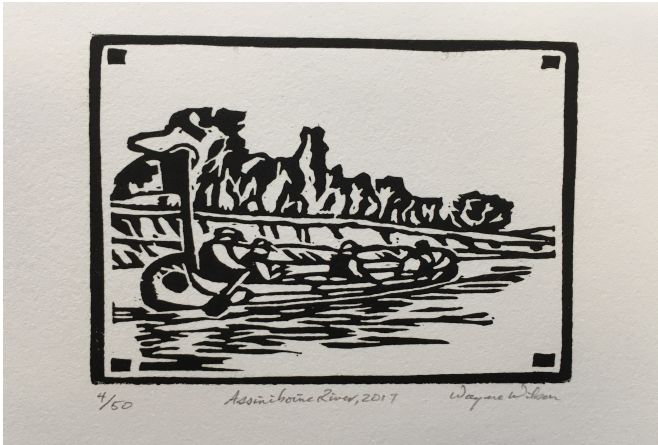
**Entry fee for the

Our goal for the next 5 years

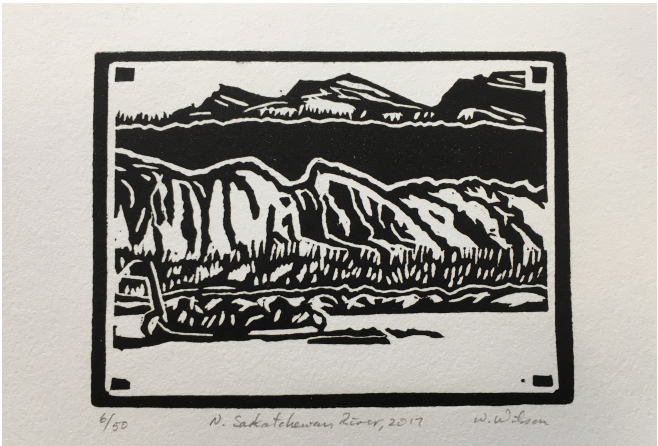
- **2018**
